Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve

This 268-acre preserve protects one of the most spectacular dolomite and limestone gorges in the state. Registered as a National Natural Landmark in 1968, Clifton Gorge encompasses a 2-mile stretch of the Little Miami State and National Scenic River, just east of John Bryan State Park.

Geologically, it is an outstanding example of interglacial and post-glacial canyon cutting. At one point, the river funnels through a deep, narrow channel, which was apparently formed by the enlarging

and connecting of a series of potholes in the resistant Silurian dolomite bedrock. In other sections of the gorge, cliff overhangs have broken off forming massive slump blocks scattered along the valley floor.

The shaded, north-facing slopes provide a cool, moist environment for northern species including hemlock, red baneberry, Canada yew, arbor-vitae and mountain maple. This is one of the most spectacular sites in the state for viewing spring wildflowers including the rare snow trillium.

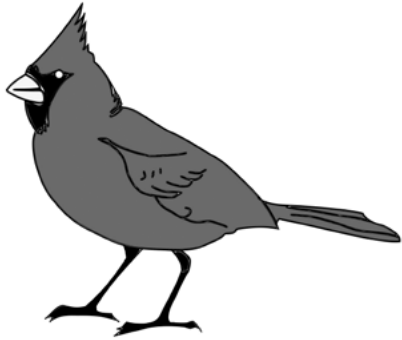

The Yellow Springs-Clifton Connector Trail



The Little Miami Railroad was incorporated in 1836 to connect the important industrial cities of Cincinnati and Springfield. Within a decade, the railway had expanded upward along the Little Miami River to reach Springfield, and later merged with other railroads to eventually reach the state capital and points East. For nearly a century and a half, the railroad was in operation as part of an extensive railway system stretching to the eastern seaboard; however, by the 1970s the Interstate Highway system had become the dominant transportation network – the remnant Little Miami Railroad had been abandoned. The graded right-of-way was well suited for a multi-purpose trail often referred to as a “bike path.” The trail is now known

as the Little Miami Scenic Trail and is the longest such trail in Ohio and the third longest in the country, and is widely regarded as one of the finest examples of a multi-use trail for its stunning scenery along the river corridor.

Since the early planning days of the Little Miami Scenic Trail there have been spurs or extensions from the Trail to nearby sites of significance. One such extension, from the Village of Yellow Springs to John Bryan State Park – and eventually to the Village of Clifton – has been discussed for decades and always seemed just out of reach due to the lack of a convenient right-of-way such as the vacated railbed that made the main Trail possible. A new plan is finally off the ground and shows some promise that the

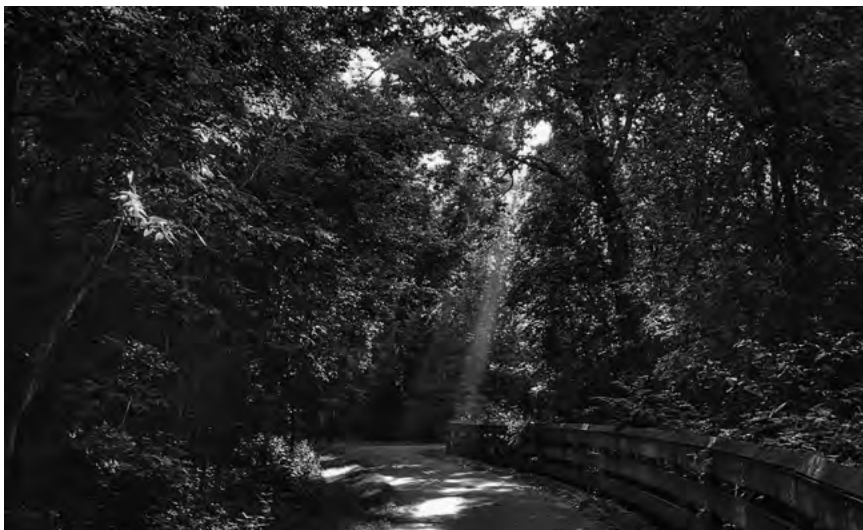
The Yellow Springs-Clifton Connector Trail

Yellow Springs Clifton Connector, as it's called, could become a reality after all.

In the fall of 2015, Clifton Mayor J. Alex Bieri and Miami Township Trustee Chris Mucher held a meeting with Ohio Department of Transportation District 8 to discuss plans at the time to resurface State Route 343 the following summer. Mayor Bieri felt the road could be widened to accommodate bicycles on the shoulder along the road between Yellow Springs and Clifton. However, the route was originally a mule trail where wagon teams carried goods from the Mills in Clifton Gorge to the Rail Station in Yellow Springs and was never well engineered as a roadway. The narrow lanes and poor construction proved

fatal flaws to the Mayor's hopes for redesigning the road. Moreover, the idea of widening the road turned out to be not only impractical and costly, it still fell very much short of a scenic and safe trail for cyclists and hikers.

Discussions of a connector trail continued the following year, and by the summer of 2017 a coalition of local leaders and organizations began to form to pursue a feasibility study. Greene County Regional Planning hosted meetings with Village Officials from Yellow Springs and Clifton, Township trustees, and representatives from Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Greene County Parks, Tecumseh Land Trust, Glen Helen Ecology Institute, and Rails to Trails Conservancy,

among others. The group began working with an engineering and design company that specialized in trail planning and construction. By 2018 \$45,000 was put toward a feasibility study of the project. This money was from the local governments of Clifton, Yellow Springs, Miami Township, a grant from the Yellow Springs Foundation, and capital budget funds from the State.

As planning continued, landowners were brought in to the discussions, and many have been very supportive of the Trail project but concerned about losing property frontage or general encroachment. Creative solutions are being sought in every case. This may force sections of the new Trail to share the existing road or having more road crossings than otherwise necessary, but these solutions will ultimately make the project more of a community endeavor: by and for the people who will enjoy it, something the railroads were too large-scale to do.

The current plan is a 3-phase project which will take years to build. The first phase begins at the Yellow Springs Station and follows US 68 to SR 343, ending at the entrance to Glen Helen. Phase 2 continues along the Glen's border to William and Mary Ct. and along SR 370 to John Bryan State Park. The

final phase will traverse the Park and end at the Clifton Gorge parking lot on SR 343. Challenges along the proposed route include mixed topography, environmental impacts, farmland protection easements, and private landowner concerns, among others. It will not be easy or straightforward to construct. A pending Clean Ohio grant application to be awarded in November 2019 could start the construction of phase 1 by 2020, but more funding will be needed and piecing it together will be an arduous process. Local leaders are hopeful that the progress made thus far will not be in vain and are committed to a continued effort.

The long-term goal of the Yellow Springs-Clifton Connector Trail is simply to improve the quality of life for area residents by connecting them to the State Park, natural areas such as Clifton Gorge, and the entire Little Miami Scenic Trail, all by hiking, biking, or other non-motorized transport. Just as the railroads of centuries past have shaped the present landscape, future transportation systems are sure to come and change our modes of development. But although the future is never certain, it seems a safe bet that walking, bicycling and enjoying the outdoors will continue to be as important as ever.

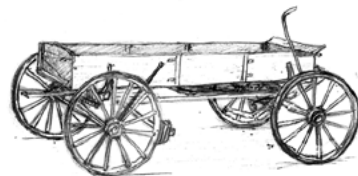

The Clifton Opera House

5 South Clay Street, Clifton OH

Clifton Opera house is a beautifully preserved concert hall that was built in 1893. Originally known as the town hall, it has been a venue for minstrel shows, medicine shows, school plays, church activities, style shows, dinners, dances, weddings, meetings, all variety of concerts, theatrical productions, and even basketball games. The tower was taken down in the 1920s and the building was not used for many years. Then, in 1978, part of the north wall fell in. Howard Printz, then President of the Clifton Historical

Society, began raising funds to save the historic building. Thanks to his dedicated work and the generosity of the donors who cared so much for the Opera House, it is restored and continues to be a valuable part of the Clifton community. The Opera House is owned by the Village and managed with the help of Christin Zerbe-Leckey, the Opera House Event Coordinator.
